

THREE DIMENSIONAL GREETING CARDS

Accordion folds allow a card to fold flat for mailing but open up to become a three dimensional greeting. Die-cut windows create openings that are perfect for hanging stickers that add movement to the card. The color palette and sticker selection dictate the theme of the card, making it easy to adapt this accordion card to any occasion.

1. Cut a strip of paper that measures 6.5" x 25"
2. Crease and accordion fold every 5 inches.
3. Die-cut a window opening through the folded card.
4. Sandwich white thread between matching pairs of vellum stickers.
5. Position each sticker so that one hangs in each window opening. Fasten the thread in place above the window openings with coordinating stickers. Add additional decorative stickers underneath each window. (Fig.1)
6. Cut a 4.5" x 12" strip from coordinating paper and wrap it around the folded card, concealing the window openings. Overlap the two ends and fasten closed with double stick tape. (Fig.2)
7. Decorate the folded strip with co-ordinating stickers to complete the card. Slide the wrapper on and off to view the card. (Fig.3)

MATERIALS

- Stickers: Mrs. Grossman's
- Plain Paper: Canson
- Double stick tape
- Square Die: Ellison
- Patterned Paper: Provo Craft
- Creasing tool: E.K. Success
- White Thread
