

Jeans with Antiqued Lace



Materials needed:

- Old pair of jeans
- Two packages of assorted *Wimpole Street Creations* mini crochet pieces*
- Two yards of *Wimpole Street Creations* small double scallop trim*
- Three to five yards each of black, green and gold embroidery floss*
- Chenille needle*
- Fabric dye
- Washable fabric glue

Tea dye all the lace and let dry. Iron as necessary.

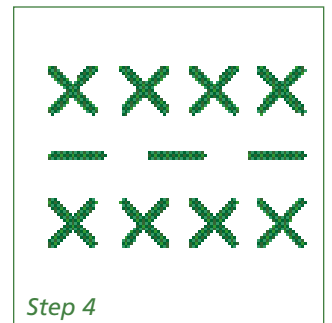
1 Cut off or remove the stitching from the hem of each jeans leg. Slit both outside leg seams 8" from the bottom. Cut one piece of double scallop trim in half lengthwise.

2 Pin the cut edge of the lace to the inside split edge of the jeans leg. Apply glue to a small section at a time between the layers. Go down one side, along the bottom and up the other side of each leg as shown in the photo. Glue the mini crochet pieces to the jeans as desired.



3 Thread the remaining double scallop piece through the belt loops and glue in place along the top and bottom edges for a belt. Snip the crochet threads over the button and buttonhole if necessary and glue the edges to secure. Fold the ends of the belt to the inside and glue in place.

4 Add decorative stitch rows 1-1/2" apart on each pant leg, using six strands of floss (see stitch diagram).
