

Battenburg

Open Rose and Rosebud

Materials needed:

- *One dozen Wimpole Street Creations™ fabric and Battenburg heart doilies (328DY-4) (this will make three small roses)
- *One dozen Wimpole Street Creations™ fabric and Battenburg heart doilies (328DY-6) (this will make two large roses and four rosebuds)
- *Three 18" pieces of 22 gauge wire
- Fabric stiffener
- Floral stem, optional
- Floral tape, optional
- Leaves, optional
- Instructions

Instructions:

OPEN ROSE

1. Cover a piece of cardboard with plastic kitchen wrap.
2. Roll a doily into a cone shape with the wrong side out. Fold back the outer edge of lace. Twist the wire around the cone 1-1/2" from the bottom (see diagram 1). Do not cut the wire until the end of step #5.
3. Wrap the second doily around the cone, pinching the bottom to gather it around the wired base. Wrap the wire around the base of the doily twice (see diagram 2).
4. Place the third doily on the rose, beginning half-way around the last petal. Pinch the doily to gather it at the wired base. Wrap the wire around the base of the doily twice (see diagram 3).
5. Add the fourth doily to the rose, beginning half-way around the last petal. Pinch the doily to gather at the base. Secure with the wire. Trim off excess wire
6. Curl the edges of the lace outward to form petals (see diagram 4).
7. Lay the roses on the prepared cardboard. Spray or brush fabric stiffener on the entire surface of the roses. Allow the roses to dry thoroughly.
8. A floral stem may be added by pushing it into the base of the rose. Wrap the base and the stem with floral tape. Leaves may be added by wrapping them along the stem as it is covered with the tape.

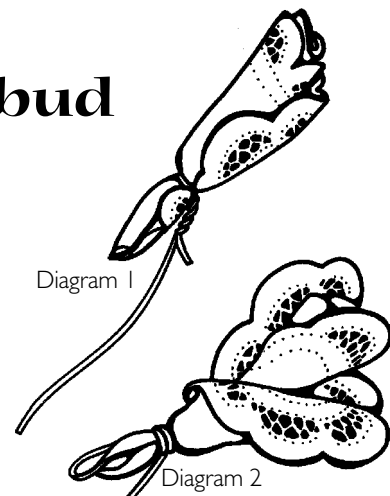

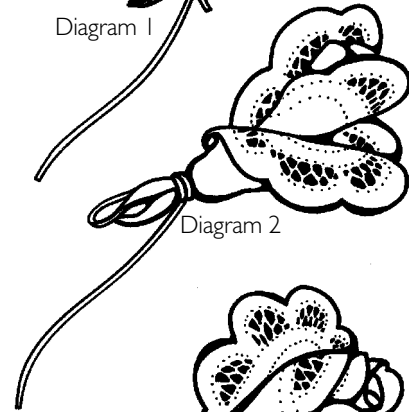

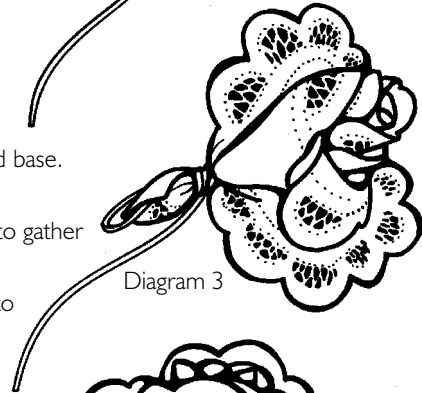
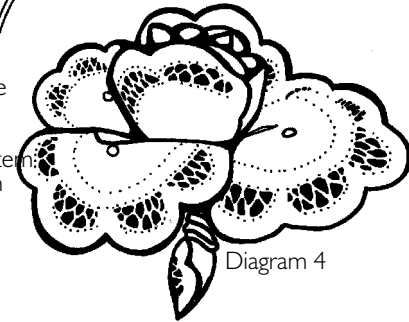

ROSEBUD

1. Fold the doily with wrong sides together (see diagram A).
2. Fold the right edge on an angle (see diagram B). Continue rolling and gathering the doily into a cone shape. Wrap the wire tightly around the base of the doily to secure.
3. Curl back the edges of the lace to form the rosebud petals (see diagram C).
4. Lay the rosebuds on the prepared cardboard. Spray or brush the fabric stiffener on the entire surface of the rosebud. Allow to dry thoroughly.
5. A floral stem may be added by pushing it into the base of the bud. Wrap the base and stem with floral tape. Leaves may be added by wrapping them along the stem as it is covered with the tape.

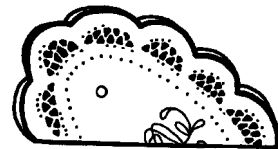

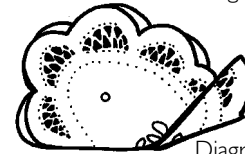

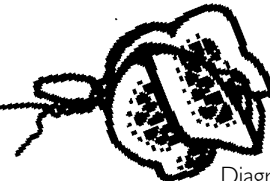
